Main message of this talk in one sentence – Why did Jesus choose Bethany as his "home" for his last	
week on Earth? What was it about Mary and Martha's home that make it such a place of welcome, care	
and hospitality? What does this say about our homes whether we are a home owner or just passing	
through?	

Main points

Where is your home?

• Could be any number of places from where you live now, to where you grew up, to where you long to be

What do we mean by home?

• Is it an idealised "Grand Design" view or more realistic? Is it a reality or a distant dream? Do we have a home?

Jesus had no home

- "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." (Matt 8:20)
- But he did visit Bethany several times ... it was his adopted home.

Why Bethany? Looking at all his visits in the NT we see that it was a...

- Place of welcome ... Mary and Martha opened their home to him (Luke 10:38-41)
- Place of crisis ... where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-44)
- Place of ascension ... where Jesus said goodbye (Luke 24:50-53)
- Place Jesus chose as his lodgings for his final week on Earth (Mat 21:17, Mark 11:1, Luke 19:29, John 12:1 start the last week of Jesus life)

Why did Jesus chose Bethany for that last week?

- It was a place of memories ... where Jesus raised Lazarus from the death (John 12:1)
- It was a place of friends ... he loved them and they loved him (John 11:5, 12:2)
- It was a place of care ... Mary recognised what Jesus was going through and anointed him for his death (John 12:3, 7-8)
- But it was also a place of hurt ... where one of his disciples, Judas, began his betrayal (John 12:4-6)

Home for the Christian

- Our true spiritual home may be in heaven (Phil 3:20, 1 Pet 2:11), but we are still called to make our earthly homes places of welcome, hospitality and care
- This is true if you are a homeowner settled in Bristol
- Or just passing through (see Jer 29:4-7)
- And also true for our spiritual home at Christ Church
