

YEAR OF GROWTH TEACHING ARC Mini-series Bearing Fruit in every season (27 May to 24 June 2018)

## General Guidance for Small Community Leaders & Church Family Members -

This series involves members of our church family giving extended testimony to the way God is enabling them to bear fruit in the seasons of life in which they find themselves.

We've deliberately chosen a variety, to illustrate the reality of 'seasons' in our lives

- Some (like moving to be near the grandchildren) arise naturally
- Others (such as facing illness) come unexpectedly
- Some are welcome seasons
- Others are not

But the point is that God calls us and enables us to bear fruit in EVERY season of life, whether natural or unexpected, welcome or not.

<u>Main message of this talk in one sentence</u> – We've had a season of an unexpected cancer diagnosis and then subsequent treatment. God has been so faithful to us and although in a worldly sense it has been incredibly tough season, from a faith point of view we've never felt closer to God or seen more of his outworking in our lives. He's walked this journey with us, carrying us at times, and He promises to keep walking alongside us.

## Questions -

1) Lucy talked about the four pillars of what she believes (God is good; nothing is impossible for God;

everything I need was won at the cross; I have significance in the kingdom), what is it that you know to be true that underpins your faith?

2) Reuben and Lucy prayed for a community in Bristol. What is on your heart at the moment to pray for? It doesn't need to be massive, just what one thing would you really like to see in your life that you are praying about?

3) How are you creating an environment for growth and for God to move in your life? Who have you shared that with?
